

Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan University (DSU) remains unwavering in its dedication to Sustainable Development Goal 2 - Zero Hunger. In keeping with this commitment, DSU employs a comprehensive strategy to mitigate hunger within its campus and the annual report for 2023 is presented here. This includes significant reductions in food bills and merit-based scholarships for students from underprivileged communities, females, and those from lower-income brackets. Moreover, DSU provides students from Andhra/Telangana, Kerala, and Tamil Nadu the choice to select from menus specific to their regions, all of which are sourced from local producers who adhere to sustainable

farming practices. Notably, all purchases are made locally within a 100 km radius, with a particular focus on economically disadvantaged rural villages. DSU also broadens its impact by sharing its resources, such as labs, seeds, feedstocks, etc., with local farmers.



## Strategies to Mitigate Hunger on

**Campus:** DSU's method to tackle hunger on campus incorporates several initiatives. The university offers substantial discounts on food bills and merit scholarships to students from OBC/SC/ST communities, females, and those from lowerincome brackets. This dual support system ensures comprehensive aid for the overall well-being of these students.


**Sustainable and Inclusive Food Choices:** DSU's commitment to sustainable and inclusive food choices is demonstrated by its region-specific menus. Students from Andhra, Kerala, and Tamil Nadu are given the choice to select from menus that cater to their cultural tastes. All food purchases are sourced locally within a 100 km radius, emphasizing sustainable farming practices and supporting local farmers and producers, especially those in economically disadvantaged rural villages. **Nutritious and Affordable Food:** The university's pledge to provide nutritious and affordable food choices is reinforced by the region-specific menus. DSU ensures that these options are not only healthy but also cater to the diverse culinary tastes of students, promoting a sense of inclusivity and cultural sensitivity.

**Contribution to Local Economy through Sustainable Procurement Policies:** DSU's sustainable procurement policies are crucial to its commitment to the local economy. All purchases are made within a 100 km radius, with a deliberate emphasis on economically disadvantaged rural villages. This approach not only supports local farmers and producers but also uplifts communities facing economic hardships.

**Training Program for Local Farmers** and Food **Producers/Knowledge Sharing Sessions:** DSU's inclusivity in knowledge-sharing initiatives continues to benefit farmers and food producers, emphasizing The sustainable practices. university provides a platform for collaboration and skill enhancement, ensuring that local producers align their practices with principles of sustainability. Bridging the Gap between **Farmers** Local and Producers: DSU's recognition of inclusive practices extends to region-specific menus, creating a direct connection between students and local farmers. By offering choices that represent the culinary diversity of Andhra,



Kerala, and Tamil Nadu, the university strengthens the bond between the campus and the local agricultural community. **Collaboration through Shared Facilities with Local Farmers:** DSU amplifies its impact by sharing its facilities, including labs, seeds, feedstocks, etc., with local farmers. This collaborative effort ensures that farmers gain access to essential resources (seeds, onion bulb, biofertilizer,

vermicompost etc.,) at subsidised rates and expertise, fostering a mutually beneficial relationship that contributes to sustainable agricultural practices and community development.

**Food Waste Tracking Across the Campus:** DSU has implemented a robust system to track food waste across the campus. This initiative involves regular monitoring and analysis of food consumption patterns, allowing for informed decisions to minimize waste and enhance efficiency in food management.

DSU's creative strategies to address hunger on campus, including region-specific menus, sustainable procurement practices, and shared facilities with local farmers, demonstrates in commitment.

### **Standard Operating Procedure for Measuring Food Waste**

- Food waste is measured in terms of post-consumption.
- The post consumption waste is taken as plate waste + untouched food after every meal.
- The dining hall manager maintains a separate log sheets to monitor post consumption food waste.
- The measurement of the post consumption waste is on daily basis.
- The reason for either kind of food waste is also entered in the log sheets maintained by the dining hall managers.

- Persons belonging to the communities of Christian, Muslim, Sikh, Buddhist, Parsi and Jain are considered as "Religious Minority".
- Persons belonging to the Minority communities who are natives of Tamil Nadu and having Telugu, Urdu, Kannada, Malayalam, Sourashtra and Marathi as their mother tongue as "Linguistic Minorities".
