- ❖ Persons belonging to the most economically and socio-culturally disadvantaged groups in India are the Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STs).
- ❖ The Other Backward Class is a collective term used by the Government of India to classify castes which are educationally or socially backward. It is one of several official classifications of the population of India, along with General castes, Scheduled Castes, and Scheduled Tribes (SCs and STs).
- ❖ Persons belonging to the communities of Christian, Muslim, Sikh, Buddhist, Parsi and Jain are considered as "Religious Minority".
- ❖ Persons belonging to the Minority communities who are natives of Tamil Nadu and having Telugu, Urdu, Kannada, Malayalam, Sourashtra and Marathi as their mother tongue as "Linguistic Minorities".
